



**VILLAGE OF ELBURN**

**NOTICE TO PRESS**

Illinois State Statute 5 ILCS 120/2 is commonly referred to as the “Open Meetings Act.” Paragraph (a) of the Act states, in part, “Every public body shall give public notice of the schedule of regular meetings at the beginning of each calendar or fiscal year and shall state the regular dates, times and places of such meetings. An agenda for each regular meeting shall be posted at the principal office of the public body and at the location where the meeting is to be held at least 48 hours in advance of the holding of the meeting.”

In order to comply with the law, at the beginning of each calendar year, the Village of Elburn schedules many “regular” meetings of the Village Board of Trustees, the Committee of the Whole, the Planning Commission and the Tree Board. Such schedules are provided to the local and general press to comply with other sections of the Open Meetings Act.

From time to time, a “regular” meeting will not be held, even though the meeting appears on the published meeting calendar. This usually happens when there are no issues that are ready for discussion, or a petition is not yet ready for presentation. Since the Open Meetings Act requires that the agenda be posted at least 48 hours in advance of the meeting, this is referred to as a “lack of agenda.”
