Date: July 13, 2022

Below are Public Works highlights for the second quarter of 2022:

- Received two spare pumps from Metropolitan Pump – 1 rebuilt pump for lift station 1 at Blackberry Creek and 1 brand-new pump for the Dempsey lift station.
- Pothole patching.
- Ruben Acosta resigned.
- On E North St (just east of Knuckleheads), an underground abandoned water service line was leaking and bubbling up into the street. Public Works completed the repair by shutting the line off and capping it at the main.
- Jetted sanitary and storm lines in the Lions Park manhole.
- Cut excess pipe for better flows in two sanitary manholes.
- Cleaned out the ditch at North Route 47 and jetted the storm culvert under Route 47.
- Replaced the Y strainer at Well 4 for the booster pump lines.
- Removed several dead trees from Byerhof Park.
- Met onsite in Elburn Station Unit 1 with engineers to review trees, streetlight wiring and conduct curb damage inspections.
- An increase of utility inspections with the arrival of spring.
- Replaced some mailboxes that were hit by snowplows while plowing.
- Prescribed burn of Prairie Park as a joint effort between Elburn Public Works and the Elburn & Countryside Fire Protection District.
- Hydrant flushing throughout town – completed at record pace.
- Reinstalled grit pump at the WWTP. Tri-R rewired the grit pump to waterproof the electrical.
- Supt VanBogaert attended the Kane County Water Association monthly meeting where EEI gave updates on Lead Service Line Regulations and Impacts to Water Utilities.
- Obtained bids for equipment purchases during the fiscal year.
- Annual in-person Arbor Day Celebration held on Saturday, April 30, at the Elburn Station Community Park.
- Bid opening for the 2022 Streets Program. Project was awarded to Builders Paving LLC.
- The WWTP hosted 20 advanced placement Environmental Science students from Kaneland High School.
- Annual inspections by the Elburn & Countryside Fire Protection District of all wells, pump houses, etc. There were no violations and all inspections passed.

- Tree cleanup at the Metra Station in preparation of the prescribed burn of the detention pond.
- A total of 33 new parkway trees planted.
- Ongoing fire hydrant repairs.
- Met onsite with three firms regarding open space restoration and management at SSA #2 (Blackberry Creek).
- Repaired a water service line leak on Railroad and Nebraska Streets, across from the old packing plant.
- Monthly water samples for IEPA reporting purposes.
- Jetted approximately 450' of blocked storm sewer/field drainage pipes at the Meadows Basin off Dempsey.
- Near the old packing plant on W Nebraska Street, cleared debris, trees and overgrowth around a stormwater outlet under the railroad tracks from Forest Preserve property to approximately 500' south of the tracks.
- Received new trailer.
- The 2" line feeding Taco Bell ruptured underneath the building and was repaired by Campton Construction.
- Filed the Village's Annual Facility Inspection Report for NPDES Permit for Stormwater Discharges from Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4) with the EPA and posted it on the Village website.
- The overhead door for the newer hoop building was installed.
- Public Works is raised fire hydrants (extensions) in the area where the 2022 Streets Program will occur.
- Repaired the hydrant at the corner of Route 47 and Shannon St. A 5" piece of steel had damaged the lower seal in the hydrant. A rep from East Jordan came to the site to help repair the hydrant.
- Met with EEI for possible options for Second Street drainage issues.
- Bid opening for the sewer lining project occurred.
- Busy IEPA testing period at the WWTP.
- Baxter & Woodman sprayed willows, weeds and cattails at the Metra Station and on Paul Street.
- A streetlight was knocked down on N First Street and was replaced.
- Watering of newer parkway trees.
- Three of four fire hydrants were replaced within the boundaries of the 2022 Streets Program.

Work Orders

There was a total of 239 work orders during the second quarter compared to 300 for the same quarter last year. A summary breakdown is shown below:

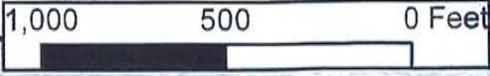
An area on E Pierce Street (between 3rd & 4th Streets) is served by city water but no sanitary sewer—they have individual septic systems. It is estimated that nine homes are impacted (see “X’s” on attached map). In addition, there are no curb inlets for storm sewer/street drainage.

Input is requested from the Village Board regarding a potential additional expense for installation of sanitary sewer and storm sewer on E Pierce Street between 3rd and 4th Streets. Attached is a cost estimate prepared by EEI for the sanitary sewer installation. An estimate for storm sewer installation has not yet been calculated.
